Who is Our Neighbor?

If you're lucky, you know what it's like to have a good neighbor. Maybe you can depend on yours to bring you a plate when you are sick or check your mail when you're out of town. The truth is, everyone in our community is our neighbor and we should all aim to lift one another up.

The College also wants to be a good neighbor to those around us and so we're excited to announce the introduction of DWC's **Good Neighbor Scholarship**. This two-year scholarship is for qualifying candidates from nearby communities who are interested in pursuing an Associate of Arts degree in Theology and Religious Studies, Intercultural Studies or Interdisciplinary Studies. It covers the **entire** cost of tuition, books and college fees, excluding any Pell Grant for which the student qualifies.

For scholarship recipients, this is an opportunity to learn in our intercultural environment, expand their knowledge and earn transferrable credits.

In return, these local learners will enrich the DWC community by enhancing our relationship with the people in surrounding communities, exposing our students to more native English speakers.

To qualify, applicants must be a resident of Delaware, Dubuque, Clayton, Jackson or Jones counties in Iowa, Grant County in Wisconsin or Jo Daviess County in Illinois because recipients must have their own living arrangements off campus. Candidates also need to be high school graduates or equivalent, have U.S. citizenship or be a legal permanent resident and meet academic requirements.
