

The world I have seen has been Girard, PA, Bordentown, NJ, Perrysburg, OH, rural upstate New York, East Troy, WI, Epworth, IA, and stops in a few other places. Vaccinations: The Dubuque County Health Department and the Greater Dubuque Development Corporation have been attentive to the DWC community in helping us find opportunities for COVID-19 vaccinations during this past week: 59 students and employees received their first dose of vaccine in the past week; another 22 are scheduled for the coming weeks. Within a matter of weeks, 92% of our community will be fully vaccinated.

As of today, only 5 of 97 students, 2 of 33 SVDs, and 8 of 48 off-campus employees are yet to be scheduled.

The recent Holy Week and Easter celebrations might have given the impression that the threat of a COVID-19 outbreak at DWC has passed. Unfortunately, that is far from true. The number of cases is rising in Dubuque County, and the newer variant of the disease is much more contagious. Even those who have already received the first dose of a vaccine are not fully protected until two or three

weeks AFTER their second dose. That would be AFTER graduation.

No cases of COVID-19 have been detected on campus since mid-February. Don't let down your guard! BE CAREFUL.

#### Search Committee Results For Full-Time Esl Instructor (August 2021)

The Search Committee for a Full-Time ESL Instructor was established November 2020 in accord with the normal faculty search procedure as outlined in DWC Policy Handbook 8.01.02. The committee received and reviewed 22 applications. From those 22 applications, the committee identified a slate of five viable candidates and conducted initial remote interviews with those candidates during February 2021. All-day interviews and classroom teaching demonstrations were held on-campus with two finalist candidates in March 2021. The Chair of the Search Committee submitted the committee's hiring recommendation to the VP for Academic Affairs shortly thereafter. The VP for Academic Affairs extended job offers to both finalist candidates. Unfortunately, DWC was unable to reach a mutually agreeable contract with either finalist candidate. I want to express my gratitude to the members of the Search Committee for the many hours invested in this exercise of shared governance—I share their disappointment that a contract agreement did not result despite all their excellent and dedicated efforts: Dr. Seo Hyun Park (Chair); Ms. Sharon Sinton; Ms. Gwyneth Gates, and; Dr. Benjamin Winter.

The VP for Academic Affairs will now work directly with the IELI Director to identify, interview, and recommend the expedited hiring of two Full-Time ESL Instructors for August 2021 under abbreviated emergency hiring procedures (DWC Policy Handbook 08.01.04). The VP for Academic Affairs will publish an announcement once duly qualified ESL instructors are hired.
