Patient Persistence

Many life lessons can be harvested in a garden.

I recall a day at school when I was six or seven. Each of the children was given a cup of soil and a bean seed. We planted the seed, labelled our cup and placed it near the window for some sunshine. Each day I went to check on my bean to see if anything had happened – nothing for three days. Other beans were already sprouting so I asked my

teacher if I could dig in the soil to see if my bean was coming. She said to be patient. (Patience does not come easily to a sevenyear-old.) The weekend came – and on Monday morning, I rushed into



school to see my bean cup. It had sprouted! In my eyes, it was beautiful, miraculous even.

I can also recall a day at school when I was sixty-seven. I was in the garden when someone came by to praise the beauty of the flowers in the courtyard. My response was: "I'm in charge of water and weeds, God sends the flowers." The answer came out of my mouth before I could even think about it. Every day, together with some student helpers, we give the plants some water and we pull some weeds. And God works a miracle! Of course, too much water can drown the plants. Too much weeding can trample the plants or uproot them along with the weeds.



A student needs both patience and persistence just as much as a gardener. The hard, persistent work of paying attention, asking questions, reading and studying can seem very unrewarding. But then comes the

moment of insight! From nowhere, understanding dawns. Many language students experience this rhythm of learning. They go to class and listen but can only understand a little. They memorize vocabulary, some of it sticks, some of it doesn't. They write a sentence, but it needs three corrections! After considerable hard work, something clicks, and the new language comes as if by magic. Maybe it is a miracle.

A missionary also needs patient persistence. Building bridges of friendship with faith-seekers, with the poor, with people of other cultures and other religious traditions takes real effort. Above all, missionaries must spend their lives with the others, even when the outcome is unclear. Experience testifies that wonders do happen. New friendships bloom, new hopes for the harvest arise. The road to the new creation comes into view as we join our fellow pilgrims.
