Rolling Back the Stone

The Franciscan Missionaries of Mary from Vietnam sent me an Easter greeting with the following message:


St. Mark's Gospel tells us that some women went to the tomb in the very early morning to anoint Jesus. They were saying to one another, "Who will roll back the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?" When they looked up, they saw that the stone had been rolled back; it was very large.

The message from the FMM's adds that after seeing Jesus risen from the dead, Mary Magdalen went to tell the good news to the other disciples. She was the first Evangelist!



Many women religious here at Divine Word College have had an experience like the women in Mark's Gospel. They have wondered, at some point in their lives, who would roll back the stone for them. Most of the Sisters who have joined us

at DWC have come because there were big obstacles to their pursuit of higher studies. Political repression in some parts of the world prevented some from getting an education that would allow them to integrate their religious belief with other areas of learning. Cultural neglect in other parts of the world resulted in little to no resources being invested in the education of women.



I am proud that DWC can help women experience the stone being rolled away in their lives. I am sure that many are better able to share the good news because of their studies here. As an SVD, I am a happy son of our founder St. Arnold Janssen who insisted that

the education of women was absolutely essential for building up the Church in every part of the world!

In the past twenty years, more than 150 Sisters have studied at DWC. That is a huge crowd gathered at the tomb to discover that the stone has been rolled back. Their voices are raised in joy as they share good news.

The CDC reports: COVID-19 vaccines teach our immune systems how to recognize and fight the virus that causes COVID-19. It typically takes two weeks after vaccination for the body to build protection (immunity) against the virus that causes COVID-19. That means it is possible a person could still get COVID-19 before or just after vaccination and then get sick because the vaccine did not have enough time to provide protection. People are considered fully protected two weeks after their second dose of the Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine, or two weeks after the single-dose Johnson & Johnson's Janssen COVID-19 vaccine.

DWC is assembling a list of students and employees who are interested in receiving a COVID-19 vaccine. Beginning April 5, everyone over 16 is eligible to receive a vaccine. It will take some weeks before sufficient vaccine will be available.



Undergraduate student registration will take place from Wednesday 7 April through Friday 9 April 2021. All returning undergraduate students should schedule an appointment with their academic advisor to review their academic progress in preparation for registration. Make plans now to register on time; <u>registration closes on Friday 9 April at 3:00 p.m.</u> Consult the course schedule published by the Registrar and plan your registration accordingly.

A Student Course Over/Under Load [S-LOAD] form must be completed by undergraduate students and the academic advisor at the time of registration whenever students are requesting a course overload (19 credit hours or more) or a course underload (14 credit hours or less).
