Divine Word College students have access to 42 Gale Titles making it a comprehensive source of information. Gale calls its individual databases "Titles." A database/title is a searchable collection of information.



Search for a Source in Gale

There are many different ways to search for information in Gale. Below are directions for using Gale Power Search, which searches all of Gale's titles simultaneously. You can narrow you search by searching individual title such as Gale OneFile Religion and Philosophy or Gale OneFile Psychology. The search techniques are the same across Titles.

Search all Gale Titles at once






Search a specific Title




Quick Search

- 1. Go to Gale https://www.galepages.com/divinewc/
- 2. Click the **Power Search** image (located at top right-hand side)




3. Enter your search term(s) (title, author, keyword etc.) in the Search Box





4. Click **enter** on your keyboard or click the **magnifying glass**






5. Filter results by source type. The default is **Magazines**.




6. Optional: **Filter your results**. Full text is checked by default, but make sure that it is checked if you are looking to read an entire article or book.




Advanced Search

- 1. Go to Gale https://www.galepages.com/divinewc/
- 2. Click the **Power Search** image (located at top right-hand side)
- 3. Click Advanced Search




4. Enter search terms in the search boxes. The default is by **Keyword.**






5. Optional: Use the drop-down menu to change search Gale provides numerous options. Try out different searches.





6. Scroll down to More Options. Explore the various limiters in this section. For a research paper, you will want to check the boxes for **Documents with Full Text** and Peer-Reviewed Journals.



7. Click Search



Use Additional Search Tools

Gale offers users additional ways to search. Try using **Topic Finder, Subject Guide Search**, or **Publication Search**.



Topic Finder

Do you have a topic in mind, but are struggling to find information about it? Use Topic Finder to find related topics and new keywords to use in your search.

- 1. Go to Gale
- 2. Click on the **Power Search** image
- 3. Click Go to Topic Finder



- 4. Enter your search terms in the search box
- 5. Press Enter on the keyboard or click the magnifying glass






A search for "American diet" gives me more ideas for search terms. For example: "Nutrition in the United States" or "American Cooking"



6. Optional: Change the **Visualization**. The default is **Tiles**. Click **Wheel** to change the visualization.





7. Click a topic on the wheel or tile. It narrows your original search to results to the documents also containing that subject or term.

Subject Guide Search

Subject terms are specific words assigned by a databased to describe different sources. Think of them as the "official" terms. You are probably used to searching by keyword, but searching by the subject term can help you find more resources

- 1. Go to Gale
- 2. Click on the **Power Search** image
- 3. Click Go to Subject Guide Search




- 4. Enter a keyword, topic, or phrase in the **Search Box**
- 5. Click Search




The search gave me 4 main **subject terms**: Medieval art, Medieval Art (Nonfiction work), Medieval art objects, and Art Religion, and Politics in Medieval China: The Dunhuang Cave in the Zhai Family (Nonfiction work)





6. Click on one of the main subject terms



7. Optional: Change **Results**. The default is **Magazines**. Click the document type you are looking for such as **Academic Journals**, **Books**, **News**, **Images**, or **Videos**.






8. Optional: Click Subdivisions to find a narrower subject term





9. Optional: Click **Related Subjects** to find broader, narrower, and related terms.

| BT | Broader term | A heading for a more general concept |

Publication Search

This is a helpful feature if you would like to find sources from a known publisher. For instance, if you would like to see all of the issues of the *First Things* journal, this feature would allow you to find this publication directly.

- 1. Go to Gale
- 2. Click on the **Power Search** image
- 3. Click Go to Publication Search



4. Enter the publication name in the search box



5. Click Search






Save Documents, Citations, and Highlights

Gale allows you to save documents, citations, and highlights to your computer or email. Additionally, you can save to your personal Google or Microsoft account. You do not have a personal account in Gale. DWC students can use their dwci.edu email to login.

- 1. Go to Gale
- 2. Click Power Search Image
- Click Sign in with Google and/or Sign in with Microsoft (top right-hand corner)

- 4. For Microsoft: Click Accept. You will be redirected back to the main page








5. For Google: Choose an account (you may only have one)



6. Click Allow




You will be redirected to Gale's main page. You are now signed in.



Highlights and Notes can be saved by going to Highlights and Notes (See section below)




Use Highlights, Notes, and Definitions


When you are reading a document in Gale, you can highlight sections of the text with your cursor and then choose to highlight, take a note, or define the text.

- 1. Go to Gale
- 2. Go to Power Search
- 3. Search for an article
- 4. Click on an article
- 5. Use your cursor to highlight a word or section of the text
- 6. Once you are done highlighting, taking notes, or defining text (See below for more instructions on each feature), click **Highlights and Notes**





- 7. Click View all Highlights and Notes
- 8. Save your Highlights and Notes



9. Click Send to... or Download




10. Choose Send To... or Download location



Highlights

1. Use your cursor to highlight a word or section of the text





2. Click **Highlight**, and then choose a color




The text will now show up in that color until you end your session.

- 2. Click Notes




- 3. Write a **note**

Use Gale's Dictionary Feature


Gale's **Dictionary** is at the bottom of every webpage.






1. Click **Dictionary**
