
Dear Divine Word,

With the return of faculty, staff, students and SVD members to DWC, COVID-19 has also come along. Our extensive testing, with the "instant" antigen tests and the more sensitive PCR saliva tests, has revealed 23 persons with a COVID infection. Happily, they have not experienced serious symptoms.

Currently there are 8 persons isolating on campus. The other 15 persons do not live on campus or have completed their isolation period over the past weekend.

What can you do to help prevent the further spread of infections?


- 1. Get tested as soon as possible if you feel any symptoms: sore throat, runny nose, cough, fever etc. The college has plenty of PCR tests available, and will have more rapid antigen tests in a week or so. In the meantime, rapid tests are also available at Walgreens on JFK Road, and at Lab Elite at Kennedy Mall. Information is available at https://www.dubuquecountyiowa.gov/565/Local-COVID-19-Testing-Options.
- **2. Wear a mask!** Masks help reduce COVID infections, but they also reduce the spread of colds and the flu!
- **3. Get vaccinated or boosted** if you have not yet done so. Br. Mike has information available on where and when you can get a shot. You can also find information at https://www.dubuquecountyiowa.gov/567/COVID-19-Vaccinations.
- **4. Avoid crowds of people** if you do not know their vaccination status. (The DWC community is 98% vaccinated, and two thirds or more have received a booster.)
- **5. Fans with filters** attached have been placed in most classrooms and many offices. Leave them on at all times. They help reduce the amount of COVID, flu and cold virus in the air.

The most recent DWC COVID-19 Guidance (#36) is attached. I have also included a copy of some clarifications of the DWC guidelines for isolation of those who have become infected with COVID-19.

Isolation and Quarantine. Isolation is a time of separation for those who have become infected with COVID-19. Quarantine is a time of separation for those who have come into close exposure to COVID-10.

The CDC now recommends a shortened time of isolation because scientific research has demonstrated that the majority of COVID transmission occurs early in the course of illness, generally in the 1-2 days prior to onset of symptoms and the 2-3 days after.

The CDC also recommends that *quarantine* is not necessary for those who have received their booster shot, or who have been vaccinated within the past six months.



The number of residents of Dubuque County who have tested positive has risen rapidly since the end of December. The number of infections is expected to continue rising in the coming weeks.

Since the beginning of the pandemic, more than 20% of all county residents (21,135 confirmed cases) have suffered a COVID-19 infection. More information is available at: https://www.cityofdubuque.org/1649/Coronavirus-COVID-19-Pandemic

Departure of Fr. Aris Martin SVD

With some sadness, I inform the Divine Word College Community that Fr. Aris Martin SVD will not be teaching in the new semester. Having completed his doctorate degree at the prestigious Jesuit University of Santa Clara in May of 2021, he returned to Divine Word College to prepare his dissertation for publication and to begin teaching at DWC in January 2022.

However, the unexpected deaths of both his Auntie and his brother, within months of one another, have been a very painful blow for him and his family.



Aris has reported feeling emotionally exhausted both because of the deaths in his family and because of the heavy work required for him to complete his doctoral studies. He requested an opportunity to engage in pastoral ministry for some time to prepare himself to set out on a long-term career as a researcher, scholar and instructor.

Fr. Aris is returning to the Philippines where he can be closer to his family and where he can immerse himself in the kind of pastoral work that will give further depth and texture to his study of Filipino Contextual Theology.

Fr. Aris asked me to express his appreciation for the support and understanding that the DWC community has extended to him in the past years and recent months.

Welcome to Fr. Simon Thoi Hoang SVD



Fr. Simon has arrived from Memphis to join the Formation Team. He will work as the Spiritual Life Coordinator, helping to organize the work of the Spiritual Directors. We are grateful for his willingness to accept this new challenge.

Fr. Simon is a 1999 graduate of DWC and professed vows as a member of the Society in 2000. After completing an M.Div. degree and an M.A. in spirituality at Catholic Theological Union in Chicago, he professed final vows and was ordained in 2007. In his graduate work, he focused on the themes of reconciliation and healing in response to his own experience of leaving Vietnam as a refugee and spending two years in a refugee camp in Hong Kong.

Until recently, Simon served as pastor of Sacred Heart Parish in Memphis, Tennessee, gathering together parishioners from the Vietnamese, Hispanic and English-speaking Catholic community. He has some family members in Memphis and also in his hometown of Hue, Vietnam.

Applications for Promotion in Academic Rank SRP Submission Deadline: Tuesday, February 1, 2022

Eligible full-time undergraduate and ESL faculty may apply for promotion in academic rank upon completion of the stipulated minimum years of service. Faculty members applying for a promotion in rank must prepare a Service Report Portfolio (SRP) documenting achievement of promotion criteria for submission to the Chair of the Faculty Promotions & Awards Committee (Bro. Tony Kreinus, SVD) no later than Tuesday, February 1, 2022.

Timeline:

- February 1 Service Report Portfolio submission deadline to the Chair of the Faculty Promotions & Awards Committee
- March 1 Faculty Promotions & Awards Committee report and recommendation submission deadline to the Vice President for Academic Affairs
- March 15 Vice President for Academic Affairs recommendation submission deadline to the College President
- April 1 College President provides any formal recommendation in favor of promotion in rank to the Chair of the Board of Trustees Academic Affairs Committee
- Early May Full Board of Trustees consideration of applications for promotion in academic rank recommended by the College President at its regularly scheduled Spring meeting.

Any formally approved promotion in rank and associated pay increase granted by the Board of Trustees become effective at the beginning of the next academic year. Consult the DWC Policy Handbook 9.03 and 9.04 for further details and procedures. All eligible undergraduate and ESL faculty are highly encouraged to apply!

DWC employees,

Divine Word College will continue to monitor and test for COVID19 throughout the 2022 spring semester. To do this, we are asking that all employees participate in COVID19 testing over the next 14 weeks. Testing will help us determine whether we have COVID19 circulating within the employee community. We will use a testing schedule similar to the fall semester. Going in alphabetical order by last name, we will test 3-4 employees per week. Please see weekly schedule below to determine which week you should take your COVID19 test.

Note: if you are unvaccinated, you must test weekly



January 3, 2022

Divine Word College, in coordination with state and local public health experts, is closely monitoring reports and recommendations from national and regional health departments regarding COVID-19. Updates will be provided through email, the LOG and on the bulletin boards.

As we begin the January semester....

TESTING – **During the first "orientation" week, January 3-8,** all members of the DWC community (students, faculty, staff, SVD residents) should:

- Take a *BinaxNow* rapid antigen test (or a similar test) as a fast screen for COVID-19 infections.
- AND take a saliva PCR test (spit test) to be assured that they are not carrying the COVID-19 virus.
- AND report vaccinations and test results to Mr. Steve Winger (employees) or Fr. Long Phi Nguyen (SVDs and students).

Tests can be arranged with Br. Mike or at local pharmacies, etc.

ISOLATION – If you test positive, a minimum of five days of isolation are required.

- If you do not live on campus, please stay home.
- If you do live on campus, you should remain in your room. Meals will be brought to you. Restrooms will be separated according to the need for isolation.
- If at the **end of five days you test negative a**nd you have no symptoms or your symptoms are resolving, you can return to usual college activities. For an additional five days, you must wear a well-fitting facemask at all times, and you should not eat in the DWC dining room.
- If at the end of five days you still test positive, or still have a fever, you should continue in isolation for an additional five says, or until your symptoms subside.

FACEMASKS – are required for everyone until at least January 15.

- In the chapel always.
- In the college generally whenever in the presence of someone else.
- Facemasks are not required in the dining room or when out of doors.

DINING ROOM – The following guidelines are in effect unit at least January 15.

- Facemasks are not required when eating or drinking.
- Off-campus persons should not eat in the dining room.
- Unvaccinated persons should not eat in the dining room.

VACCINATION or WEEKLY TESTING -

- All students and all on-campus residents must be vaccinated and boosted for COVID-19. (Exceptions can be considered for medical or other reasons.)
- All off-campus employees are strongly urged to be vaccinated and boosted for COVID-19.
- Those who are not vaccinated should test for COVID-19 infection each week.

Isolation

If you test positive for Covid-19, you must spend five days in isolation, apart from the community.

1. First 5 days in your room – Use the designated restrooms and shower rooms. Your meals will be delivered to your door.

2. After the first five days -

- IF YOU HAVE NO SYMPTOMS, you may leave your room for normal activities. If quick tests are available, please take one to confirm you no longer have virus.
- *IF YOU STILL HAVE SYMPTOMS,* you must remain in your room until your symptoms resolve.

3. The second five days -

- You must wear a mask at ALL times outside of your room.
- Do not eat in the dining room (because you must remove your mask.) You can gather your food and take it to your room to eat, or to another private place.
- **4. After ten days** you are free from isolation, *if you have no symptoms*.

(Counting the days of isolation – your test date is day zero. Then count five days. On the sixth day you may be able to return to regular activities.)
