
## Black History Month

February is Black History Month in the United States and Canada. This annual observance dates back to 1925 when Carter G. Woodson, an African American, Harvard trained historian, conceived of an event to help recover and honor the history of Black people in North America. In 1970, the original weeklong event was expanded to a month of commemorations, celebrations and presentations. More recently, celebrations of Black History Month have been held in the United Kingdom, Germany and Ireland.



Sadly, the contributions of Black people to the history and culture of North American societies are often overlooked or ignored. However, people of African descent account for about 12% of the US population and about 3.5% of the Canadian population. Somewhat surprisingly, one in ten Black people living

of Washington DC, was named the first African American Cardinal in February of last year. When asked about whether he has dealt with racism during his years of priestly service, he answered: "Oh, sure.. I don't know

of any African American who hasn't tasted the bitter cup of discrimination... Now as long as I was formally dressed, I'm treated with great respect and affection. But if I take off my clerics to go out, to go shopping or run an errand, I'm in the pool of every other African American man in Washington."



**St. Josephine Bakhita** also suffered racism, discrimination and even slavery. The DWC community honored her today at Mass on the anniversary of her death; she died on Feb 8 1947. On Saturday, Feb 26, we will again commemorate her amazing life and celebrate her release from slavery and her life of service as a woman religious with Mass and a banquet.

Since SVDs first arrived in North America in 1895, we have opposed racism and ethnocentrism while promoting God's reign of universal brotherhood and sisterhood. We continue our commitment to the Black apostolate in all three North American SVD provinces. Likewise, the Holy Spirit Missionary Sisters have made service to the African American community a core part of their educational ministry, especially in the South.

Bishop Guillory is an alumnus of DWC; Bishop Steib and Bishop Francis served on the Board of Trustees of the College.



Passing the peak of the omicron wave? Our hopes for "passing the peak" were disappointed by a surprising report on Feb 2 showing new cases jumping higher once again. Dubuque County public health officials suspect that the increase in cases may be a result of new procedures at the state labs that resulted in a temporary backlog. They point out that the combined cases reported on Jan 26 and Feb 2 would still be a significant reduction over the cases reported on Jan 19 for a 7-day period. Tomorrow's Feb 9 report from the State of Iowa will help us understand if new cases really are dropping.

The total number of positive individuals in Dubuque County since the beginning of the pandemic is 24,764. That is an enormous number given that the county's population is approximately 99,653. *So, roughly one-quarter of Dubuque county's population has contracted a COVID-19 infection.* It is also estimated that 63% of Dubuque County residents are fully vaccinated. That means that a minimum of 13% of the population is still very vulnerable to COVID-19, having never contracted an infection nor having been vaccinated. We may still have a ways to go to reach the end of this sad journey.

**At DWC**, as of today, Feb. 8, all students, faculty, staff, are out of isolation. One SVD member is still completing his time in isolation. We continue to wear masks on-campus and we continue random testing for COVID-10.

#### **Congratulations to the Holy Spirit Missionary Sisters**



The Holy Spirit Sisters held their 15th General Chapter near Rome from January 13-31. A general chapter gathers representatives from a religious congregation from all over the world to pray and plan together. The Sisters have chosen Sister Miriam (Maria Angelika) Altenhofen SSpS to be their congregational leader for a six-year term from 2022-2028. Sr. Miriam was serving on the SSpS General Council from 2014-2022. She is a psychologist who has served in Germany and in Botswana.

In her first address after her election, Sr. Miriam said: "Dear sisters, dear brothers in the SVD, dear adoration sisters, dear lay partners and companions on the journey!

... It was not easy for me to accept this challenging task in a very challenging time. But I feel your loving and spiritual support. That gives me strength to courageously embrace this new role and grow into it.

"At the end, it is God's mission and we are poor and hopefully humble collaborators in this great creation and evolution of a love that wants to transform the world.

"Our congregation is worldwide and very diverse in the different parts of the globe. But wherever we are, we try to serve especially those at the margins whose voices are not heard. Maybe God wants to enter and speak to us from these margins. ...please continue to support us with your prayers and let's keep united in the Holy Spirit!"

Sr. Ilia Delio will be speaking on religion and evolution on February 24 at 7:00 p.m.. This event is sponsored by Clarke University and will be virtual.






The lecture will focus on the shift in consciousness brought about by the impact of technology and mass communication, and the irony of resistance to accepting evolution despite this ongoing human development.


