# **Setting the World on Fire**

"Do you think that I have come to establish peace on earth? No I tell you, but rather division." Those words must have been a surprise for Jesus' first-century listeners! We are still surprised today!

The Church often prays for unity, but maybe sometimes we should pray for holy division. Not all peace is a holy peace. There can be unity in sin: a unity of stubborn ignorance born of a refusal to search out the truth; unity in fear of newcomers or of people who are not part of our group; unity in cultural and racial prejudice; and unity in disregard of injustice.

Jesus specifically challenged his hearers about being closed to people who were not part of their immediate families, extended families, or clans. Though family solidarity is a good thing, it can become an enemy to the wider solidarity and open welcome of the Reign of God that Jesus called for. We could be tempted to something similar here at DWC. We could break up into smaller closed groups, looking only after our own interests.

Before talking about peace and division, Jesus said: "I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing!" There is some important cultural context here. Jesus spoke in Aramaic, which was translated into Greek, and comes to us in English more than twenty centuries



later. Experts tell us that the word Jesus used for earth is the same as an earth-oven, the way that people of his time baked bread and other food. He was giving his life as kindling for the oven, he was offering himself as saving bread for his followers, and for us still today.

In these first days of the semester at DWC, we have had the word, "Welcome!" on our lips and in our hearts. But before welcome comes "Call." Jesus came to set the world on fire, and he calls all of his disciples to follow along to help set the world on fire. All of us at DWC, students, faculty, staff, and SVDs are included in this call.





If DWC is to be an earth-oven, what is it that we should bake here? Jesus calls us to bake the daily bread of the Kingdom, to feed ourselves and the whole world with genuine unity and a wide welcome.

The key ingredients are the missionary skills that DWC promotes. We are called to *critical thinking* rather than wallowing in stubborn ignorance. We are called to *communication effectiveness* rather than staying fenced in by fear of talking with someone new or different. We are called to greater *intercultural competence* rather than being intimidated by racism or cultural prejudice. We are called to *social and global responsibility* rather than cowering in the face of injustice.

Jesus calls us to be his *missionary disciples*, to be with him in setting the world on fire! Then we can be an offering of bread, baked with truth, courage, openness and justice, for our little town of Epworth and for the wide world.

## **DWC Awarded NetVUE Faculty Professional Development Grant**

The academic year kicked off for the Faculty on August 11 with joyful news during the Faculty Institute. DWC was awarded a Faculty Professional Development Grant from the Network for Vocation in Undergraduate Education (NetVUE) to focus on developing a deeper understanding of vocation and the mission of the College. The theme for the grant program is "Vocation is our Vocation" and focuses on three areas:

- 1. Defining vocation within the mission of the College and the Arnoldus Family tradition;
- 2. Understanding the vocation of Faculty members and their contribution to student discernment of their vocation; and
- 3. Identify the needs of missionaries and how the College can help meet them.

As part of the grant project, Faculty will read *Called Beyond Ourselves: Vocation and the Common Good*, edited by Dr. Erin VanLaningham of Loras College. The book features commentaries on the purpose of higher education, the dialectic between neoliberalism and the liberal arts, and how higher education should always be in service of the common good. The Campus Reads Program will also feature the book, and community members are encouraged to read along with the Faculty. This grant is provided through the Council of Independent Colleges and funded by the Lilly Foundation.

# **Divine Word College Presidential Scholarship**

Divine Word College first awarded the Presidential Scholarship in 1979. This scholarship is a recognition of and an honor for students who show promise of superior academic achievement.





The Presidential Scholarship includes an annual award of up to \$3,000 renewable each year the recipient continues to meet the established guidelines. The award may result in a further discount of tuition. A maximum of two students may receive this scholarship in a single year.

Criteria for Selection: Students in the Undergraduate Program at Divine Word College are eligible to apply for the Presidential Scholarship provided they meet the following criteria:

- Applicants entering from high school must have a cumulative GPA of 3.50 or above.
- College transfer applicants must have a cumulative college GPA of 3.50 or above.
- Applicants who have completed secondary school or college/university studies abroad must have an acceptable equivalent cumulative GPA.
- Students in the undergraduate program may apply at any time during their studies at Divine Word College provided they have a cumulative grade point average of 3.50 or higher.

If you believe you qualify for the DWC Presidential Scholarship, please complete the application form by September 5, 2025, which you can obtain from Ms. Carolyn Waechter, the Financial Aid Coordinator. Carolyn can also answer any of your questions.







# **Summer Projects from the Maintenance Department**

This summer, the Maintenance team completed a wide range of campus improvements. Projects included tree removal, grass cutting, and repairs to address water runoff damage. Megan Hall saw extensive upgrades: dryer venting, six toilet replacements, A/C repairs, and new kitchen and bathroom faucets. Additional work included faucet and toilet seal replacements in dorms, light placement at Arkfeld House, and a major lounge remodel with electrical upgrades. Martha's Kitchen received plumbing improvements, and the state boiler inspection was successfully completed. Electrical repairs were also made to the street front entrance.

Looking ahead, we're excited to begin upgrades to the men's dorm restrooms. This project will include the installation of new urinals and shower fixtures, as well as ceiling repairs to improve ventilation and overall comfort. These enhancements aim to provide a cleaner, more functional space for our students.

We extend our sincere thanks to the Maintenance Department, Student Workers, and Housekeeping for their dedication and hard work in keeping our campus safe, functional, and welcoming.


# Seeking English Conversation Partners for ESL Students

## Use Library Hours & Access

- You need your **DWC ID** to borrow items.

## Borrowing Materials

- You can borrow books, DVDs, and other items using a self-check machine.
- Items have a **loan period** (e.g., 4 weeks) and can often be **renewed** online.
- There are no late fees.

# Online Resources

- The library offers access to databases
   (like JSTOR, Project Muse, and the Digital Theological Library) for research articles and eBooks.
- You can watch movies and shows on Kanopy.
- You can listen to audiobooks on Libby.
- We have a new subscription to the Digital Theological Library (DTL 2)!
- Check out DTL2: https://dtl2.libguides.com/home
- Ask for help if you're unsure how to use these tools.

# Interlibrary Loan (ILL)

- If the library doesn't have a book or article, you can request it from another library.
- Books take 1–2 weeks, articles take 1–4 days.

## Getting Help

- The library offers research help sessions or one-on-one support.

## **Dublic Library Access**

- You are able to use your college library card at the **local public library**.
